AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A RESTRICTED PARKING AREA; REGULATING THE PARKING OF MOTOR VEHICLES IN SAID RESTRICTED AREA; PROVIDING PENALTY FOR VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF ARCADIA, MISSOURI, as follows:

SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS.

- A. The term "motor vehicle" when used in this ordinance shall mean and include every self propelled vehicle, including all wagons, and trailers, of every type.
- B. The term "park" when used in this Ordinance shall mean the standing of a vehicle whether occupied or not, otherwise than temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading passengers or freight.
- SECTION 2. ESTABLISHING THE BOUNDARY LINES OF A RESTRICTED PARKING AREA, AND REGULATING PARKING THEREIN.
- A. There is hereby established a parking district in the City of Arcadia, Missouri, described as follows:

North side of Orchard Street between Main Street and end of Orchard Street going west (excepting therefrom the extreme West end, designated for City Hall business).

It shall hereafter be unlawful, for any person, firm or corporation to park any motor vehicle within the aforesaid described parking district.

- SECTION 3. PENALTY. That if any person, driver, operator, owner, company, firm, corporation or chauffeur violating any of the provisions of thos ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$5.00, nor more than \$100.00, or by imprisonment in the City Jail, not exceeding 90 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
- SECTION 4. SEVERANCE CLAUSE. That if any section, sentence, phrase or clause of this ordinance shall be held to be invalid for any reason by a court of competent jurisdiction, the invalidity of such section, sentence, phrase or clause shall not impair the validity of the remaining sections, sentences, phrases or clauses of this ordinance; the Board of Aldermen hereby declares that it would have passed the remaining portions of this ordinance had it known that such section, sentence, phrase or clause would be held invalid.
